2014 Ramon Magsaysay Awardees Announced

The Ramon Magsaysay Award Foundation announced that this year (2014) five individuals and one organization from Afghanistan, China, Indonesia, Pakistan, and the Philippines will receive Asia's premier the Ramon Magsaysay Award. The 2014 **Awardees** 1) Saur Marlina Manurung (Indonesia) :- She was cited for "her ennobling passion to protect and improve the lives of Indonesia's forest people" through jungle schools put up by her organization. An anthropologist by profession, she put up a "Jungle School" program for children of Indonesia's **Orang** Rimba, 2) Randy Halasan (The Philippines):- He was chosen for the award for serving the indigenous Matigsalug tribe. He put in huge efforts in teaching the children of the Matigsalug tribe in one of the remotest mountain villages Mindanao. 3) **Hu Shuli (China)**:- He is a Chinese investigative journalist whose work has led to the ouster of corrupt officials. He is the founder and former editor of 'Caijing' a business magazine famed for its groundbreaking investigative reporting that has had a profound impact on 4) Omara Khan Masoudi (Afghanistan) :- Masoudi was awarded for his courage in protecting Afghan cultural heritage. At great risk to his life, the deputy director of the National Museum of Afghanistan in Kabul led his colleagues in moving some of the museum's most precious objects to safety during the Taliban's assault on his country's cultural treasures in the 1990s. 5) **The Citizen Foundation (Pakistan)**:- The Citizen Foundation, a non-profit organisation (NGO) in Pakistan founded by six business leaders, was recognized for building 1,000 schools over hundreds of cities and towns in the country with the world's second highest number of children who 6) Wang Canfa (China) :- Wang Canfa founded the Center for Legal Assistance to Pollution Victims, which has offered free legal services to thousands of people and provided environmental law training to lawyers and others.

SS Mundra Takes Charge As RBI Deputy Governor

Subhash Sheoratan Mundra, the Chairman & Managing Director (CMD) of Bank of Baroda (BoB), took over as the new Deputy Governor of Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for a three-year term. With this appointment, Mundra will look after banking supervision, currency management, financial stability, rural credit, customer service and also the Reserve Bank's human resources & security. He was appointed to fill the vacancy created by the KC Chakrabarty who in April 2014 took voluntary retirement. Chakrabarty resigned from the Deputy Governor post two months before his five-year tenure.

India Finish Fifth AT 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games

India finished fifth in the 2014 Commonwealth Games with 64 medals (15 gold, 30 silver, 19 bronze). England took the top spot with 174 medals of which 58 were gold. 4929 athletes from 71 countries and territories of the erstwhile British Empire participated in the 11-day competition. The 2014 Commonwealth Games (officially the XX Commonwealth Games) were held in Glasgow, Scotland, from 23 July to 3 August 2014. The 21st Commonwealth Games will be held in Gold Coast in Australia.

6.1 Earthquake Strikes China's Yunnan Province

Earthquake of magnitude 6.1 on Richter scale stuck southwest Yunnan province of China on 3 August. The quake left behind a trail of destruction and devastation in the province and killed about 380 people and injured about 1800 others. This was the strongest earthquake to hit the province in 14years.

Sahul shelf is an underwater shelf stretching between northern Australia and southern New Guinea, where the Australian humpback dolphin occurs.

He created or sketched Chacha Chaudhary for the Hindi magazine Lotpot in 1969, this character was the one that made him famous. His hacha Chaudhary strips found a permanent place in International Museum of Cartoon Art, USA. According to Maurice Horn notes, Pran was given a title of Walt Disney of India in the World Encyclopedia of Comics.

Mizoram Governor Kamla Beniwal Removed

Kamla Beniwal has been relieved of her charge as Mizoram Governor on 6 August.President Pranab Mukherjee directed that Beniwal will cease to hold the office of the Governor of Mizoram. Vinod Kumar Duggal, Governor of Manipur, has been directed to discharge the functions of the Governor of Mizoram, in addition to his own duties, until regular arrangements for the office of the Governor of Mizoram are made.Beniwal was removed as Governor of Gujarat when the NDA government took over. She was transferred to Mizoram on 6 July 2014.

He has been a two-time African Footballer of the Year.

Union Government Introduced Two Labour Reform Bills In Lok Sabha The Union Government introduced two Labour Reform Bills in the Lok Sabha. The two bills are The Factories (Amendment) Bill 2014 and the Apprentices (Amendment) Bill 2014. The two bills aim at enabling the government to make certain rules in consultation with the States to ensure safety and welfare of workers at workplace. The purpose is to reform years-old Labour Laws- the Factories Act 1948 and the Apprentices Act 1961.

Uttarkhand government has formed a high level committee to conduct a detailed survey of the industries using silica dust in the state. This committee will be headed by Additional Chief Secretary S Raju. The committee would conduct its study and submit its report within two months. Apart from this, it was also decided to conduct a health check up of those working in such industries that use silica dust. The health check-up will be conducted to find that so they suffer from silicosis or any other respiratory disease, which can be caused after coming in contact with silica dust.

The court also directed the Maharashtra government to restrict the height of human pyramids to 20 feet.
